## MINUTES: February 1982 General Meeting

The 1982 General Meeting of the West End Association was held on Tuesday, February 16 at the YWCA. Ten of the twelve seats on the board were represented and three of the four officers were present. Treasurer Don Kirk was unable to attend.

The major purpose of the General Meeting is the election of officers and board members. The nominating committee presented a full slate of candidates and invited additional nominations from the floor. The new officers are : Bill Wise - President, Glen Gravlee - Vice President, Cort Meador - Treasurer, Sam Matthews - Secretary. The new Board Memembers are: Bill Leinbach, Brenda Penney, Bill Gibson, Bob Fly, Grace Humphries, Rence Callahan. The officers terms are one year; the Board Members terms are two years with six seats up for election each year.

The members heard an interesting review of The National Register of Historic Places program by Gwynne Taylor who has just completed a study of the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County area to determine the potential National Register property and areas. Crystal Towers/West End areas are designated as having high potential for listing in the Register.

There are a number of levels of involvement available under the National Register program with the affect ranging from the need to have the shade of exterior paint or type of shrub approved by the commission to no limits (except local zoning laws) on buildings or grounds by the owners but totally limiting the conversion of property to other use (such as public housing or freeways) by government agencies. The West End Association will have a committee to study this situation and report to the members.

Rence Callahan reports that the West End Association has been given the go ahead by the Planning Board to develop a street sign to identify the West End area. Rence has produced a model of the sign and plans to get cost estimates for review at the March board meeting.

The general membership approved the Board of Directors motion which provides that the retiring President will automatically become the Second Vice President.

Artwork placed next to cheap backing materials such as corrugated boards are in danger of being damaged or destroyed by chemical "burns." Chemicals contained in corrugated boards contribute to the discoloration and deterioration of art on paper. Even when artwork is protected by glass, corrugated boards used as backing can draw and hold moisture which can warp mat boards, and cause damage to the paper by attracting molds, mildew and other parasitic fungi.
