#### AN HISTORIC FUTURE LOOKS BRIGHT FOR THE WEST END

Contradiction of terms? Not really. The architectural survey for the National Register of Historic Places proceeds on schedule thanks to the perseverance of Laura Phillips and Gwynne Taylor. The proposed West End/Crystal Towers Historic District will likely encompass the largest number of individual properties ever listed in a North Carolina historic district. The nomination should be submitted to Raleigh sometime this summer, meaning we may receive National Register status before our fifth semi-annual Holiday Tour of Homes. Wouldn't that be nice?

What does it all mean? To refresh your memory, National Register listing primarily confers recognition upon the neighborhood. Other benefits include some protection from state and federally funded projects which might affect the integrity of the district as well as tax incentives for major restorations of architecturally contributing properties. The bad news (for some) is that these "tax break" properties can not be an owner-occupied single family house. Why not, you ask? That wisdom eludes the writer.

Although listing in the National Register has NO EFFECT on exterior architectural design of newly built or restored structures, it's no secret that we're looking into establishing some architectural design guidelines custom designed for the West End. Such guidelines could become binding only through a City ordinance designating a local historic or architectural appearance district. More on this later.

#### **RENT-A-KID**



The Board met at the Hunters' on May 6.

Chris Chapman reported that he's been in contact with the Parks and Recreation Department regarding the replacement of the lights at the Hanes Park entrance. These currently are broken and unattractive and extra light would increase area security there at night. He also will ask about the possibility of replacing the traffic islands at 5th and Glade and the one at Clover and Glade with island planters. These would be more attractive and might cut down on the semi-tractor-trailer trucks turning around at these intersections. We'll see what the City Traffic Engineering Department thinks about this idea.

The Board was please to hear that Petree, Stockton and Robinson has requested that its employees be careful on entering and exiting their parking lot into 4th Street. Visibility is limited and young children are often busy playing in the alley. A hearty "thank you" to our lawyer neighbors.






