INTENSIFICATION OF USES ZONING AMENDMENT REMANDED TO STAFF BY PLANNING BOARD

For those of you who have been following the history of this rather technical zoning amendment, you know that this section of our Zoning Ordinance was originally enacted in September, 1983 and amended to its present form in November, 1986. Basically, it requires that there be a hearing before the Zoning Board of Adjustment before permitting a property owner whose structure and/or property do not meet all current zoning requirements to expand his building, intensify his use or combine his lots into a larger zoning lot. The West End Association was instrumental behind the enactment of this section as it arose from many bitter experiences. The purpose of it was to create an opportunity for neighborhood input in those instances where there could be an adverse neighborhood impact. Several weeks ago, in response to a request from the Staff of the Zoning Board of Adjustment, neighborhood representatives (Bill Wise and Paul Shepard) sat down with city officials and agreed to a compromise whereby the ordinance would be amended to exempt industrial and business property (other than B-2 property) that is not adjacent to residential property from the ordinance, which would mean that those property owners would no longer need a hearing under the circumstances covered by the ordinance. On March 10th this matter came before the Planning Board and it was only earlier that week that it was learned that city staff decided that all business property should be exempted from the ordinance whether or not it bordered a residential property. Bill Wise went to the Planning Board meeting on March 10th, and after a stirring speech, the entire matter was sent back to the staff for further study. George Doughton, representing the Arches, represented the business Stay tuned.... interests.

LANDSCAPE ORDINANCE ADOPTED BY BOARD OF ALDERMEN

On a more positive note, on March 7th the Board of Aldermen adopted the landscape ordinance that had been recommended by the City-County Planning Board. This ordinance requires that parking lots hence forth be screened from public streets.




