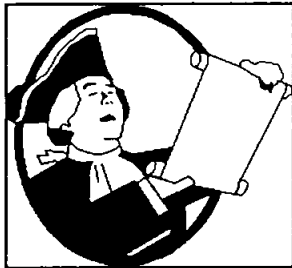

MEETING NOTES - April 4, 1989

The April board meeting was held at the home of Jay and Janine Cutchin and called to order by Martin Sokoloff, President.

Jim Fox raised the issue of an updated West End plan, including a map and the tax value and most recent sale price for each property. It would help establish selling prices, and help prevent residents selling at too low a price. The Association might look into the possibility of seeking special funds to buy distressed properties, to be held in trust until an appropriate buyer could be found. Jim Fox, Joyce Gravlee and Randolph Horner will form the core of a Long Range Planning Committee.

The Hanes Park "task force" was discussed. It is considering hiring a consultant to draw up a master plan for the park and surrounding environs. The Board went on record that they wish the West End Association to continue participating in task force discussions, but questioned the need to hire consultants/planners at this time.

A letter from Brian South and Company was read regarding the Gladstone Apartment building. The board still has some concerns about landscaping and the general approach to the site. Another letter will be written and efforts made to have a representative from Brian South meet with the board in the future.

TRAFFIC COMMITTEE NOTES - April 11, 1989

Susan Walter called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Brent McKinney and Stanley Polanis, Traffic Engineers from the City Department of Public Works met with the committee to discuss what measures should be taken to address the speeding and volume of traffic on Summit Street. While the City cannot, at this time, deal effectively with the volume, it was suggested that the West End Association request that the City 1) install raised pavement markers down the median, 2) expose cobblestones at intersections along Summit Street, 3) install humps designed to slow traffic, 4) install message plates in cobblestone locations with the word "slow," and 5) install signs indicating historic district and pedestrian walking symbols. A copy of the City's permit parking policy was given to the committee and will be considered at a later date.

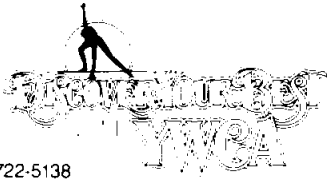

NEWS

The Raleigh newspaper ran a series of articles on billboards, focusing attention on the NC Department of Transportation. The series pointed out that many counties do not have zoning ordinances -- in those areas, DOT controls billboard permits. For a \$15 fee, a billboard company obtains a building permit. Afterward, the company must pay taxes based on 1/2 the cost of placement and construction of the billboard, as calculated by the billboard company. DOT doesn't audit company calculations. This lack of monitoring of actual placement costs by DOT results in low tax payments. Foliage control regulations are weak and there are few inspectors. DOT was stung by the publicity and scheduled meetings to collect public comment. The Western Area meeting in Salisbury was attended by more than 50 representatives of sign companies, city managers, small business owners, and the usual pack of anti-billboard radicals including West End's Bill Wise, who spoke to the problem of billboard taxing. Bill suggested taxing as they are marketed -- square feet of display multiplied by the traffic count on adjacent roadway. DOT maintains traffic counts on all major roads, so all tax base figures are aduitable from "outside" sources. Permit fees could also be established on this basis. The basic theory is to limit billboards by imposing a fair tax rate. One of DOT's own inspectors pleaded for effective regulations, and hinted that DOT intended to enforce them.

HOUSE OF THE MONTH

To kick off this feature, two houses are being presented. **ON THE RECORD:** The Hollenback-Garner House at 1028 (no. 516, ca. 1922) and the Harry A. Cunningham House at 1032 West End Boulevard (no. 517, ca. 1921) are identical twins! They are handsome, well-preserved one-and-a-half story frame bungalows with broad gable roofs with overhanging eaves, simple bargeboards, matching front dormers and Craftsman front doors. **OFF THE RECORD:** Both houses have plumbed showers with cement shower pans and drains in their basements -- yet the basements have never been improved as living spaces. Although under separate ownership, both houses were renovated simultaneously, and nearly identically, as well! Both back porches were enclosed to be used as laundry-powder rooms; however, kitchens and breakfast rooms were developed very differently. **GOSSIP:** Rumor has it that Hells Angels lived in both houses in the not-too-distant-past, put planks on top of the steep stairways leading from the street to the houses and rode their motorcycles straight into the living rooms to be serviced and repaired.
