MEETING NOTES - September 5, 1989

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. at the Walter-Ettinger home.

First item of business was a request from Stan and Peggy Simms, of 346 West End Boulevard, that the Association support their request for a twenty-five setback variance. Their home was damaged extensively during the May storm, and after inspection, the Simms decided to repair and add to their home. The Board supports the request, and Martin will write a letter to the Zoning Board.

The Traffic Committee reports that work should begin soon on Summit Street.

Work is due to begin at Grace Court Park on the small (15' x 20') playground that Mr. Armfield donated this past year. Other work is also scheduled; Joanna Hudson is the Chair of the Park Committee.

The traffic situation: time keeps going by, but the project really is moving. The estimate for the work to be done on Summit Street was deemed too high, and other bids are being solicited. Some neighbors have been contacted by the City Police who are asking opinions of traffic problems. All are agreed now that the problem exists. Cobblestones from Brookstown Avenue are being reclaimed and stored by the City.

Thanks to Bill Wise, our zoning update focuses on the Bourbon Street Bar. Ligon sold two buildings to the owners of the Bourbon Street Bar. Future use is not known, however, parking could be a problem. Bill will be ordering site plans for each, but warns we need to keep a close eye on the development.

The August storms had some serious affects throughout the neighborhood. It caused a major wash out on Brookstown Avenue, and also affected other storm drain systems over private property. Home owners insurance companies, title insurance companies, and the Realtors Association are planning to bring suit to determine who foots the bill for storm drain damage on private property. Right now, the City denies responsibility, and the homeowners policies do not cover this problem.

The Long Range Planning Committee will have a report at the next meeting.

The Nominating Committee will meet September 19 (Tuesday) at 8:00 p.m. at Marlene Larks home; the Committee will elect a Chair, and then bring a slate for nomination at our annual meeting in February.

The Board approved a membership fee increase to \$15 for regular membership, and retained the \$5 senior citizen/student category. Fee adjustment is necessary to continue newsletter quality.

The meeting was adjourned at 10 p.m.

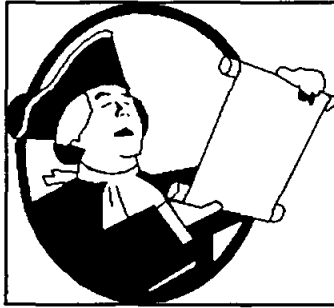
