Downtown Tour Planned

The Winston-Salem Section of the North Carolina Chapter of the American Institute of Architects and the Central Winston-Salem Association have planned a tour of downtown buildings to celebrate Architecture Week and to give the public an opportunity to learn the history and architectural significance of certain downtown landmarks. The tour will take place on Sunday afternoon, April 22. Those attending will have the choice of taking a guided tour or exploring on their own with the help of a printed guidebook giving location and information of each building. Hosts will be on hand at each of the buildings for the tour to offer assistance and information.

Tours will begin at 2 p.m. at the Sawtooth Building and will continue on the quarter hour thereafter. Those participating will return to

the Sawtooth Building afterwards for a reception. Local AIA members will serve as guides.

Among the buildings which will be open for the tour are the Lowey Building, Mercantile Plaza, the loft apartment/studio of Peter Hollingsworth Graphic Designer, Our Lady of Fatima Chapel, One Triad Park (including the Piedmont Club), and the Spruce Street Apartments (formerly YMCA).

Tickets can be purchased at the time of the tours and will cost \$3 for adults; \$2 for students and senior citizens. There will be no charge for children under 12.

West End Association Board Meeting Minutes
February 28, 1990
8:00 p.m.

The West End Board met at the lovely home of Jeff and Mary Olive Smith who were also most gracious hosts with 20 members present.

Bill Sugg, president, called the meeting to order.

The minutes from the January meeting were approved.

Old Business

The changes to the by-laws were accepted. One additional clarification was added to Article III under membership to read: "The corporation shall have no capital stock and shall be composed of dues paying members, rather than shareholders. (Words in bold were added.)"

Bill Sugg read a letter written by Nancy Pleasants, our alderperson, to Pat Swann at the city. She asked that our concerns about recycling, trash at the curbs and deterioration of water and sewer lines be addressed as soon as possible. Bill Wise reported on the city's review process of the 1961

zoning laws. The West End residents will need to stay abreast of recommendations coming up regarding a variety of zoning issues that can affect our neighborhood. A three person task force, consisting of Ben Wilson, Bill Wise and Jim Fox, was appointed by Bill Sugg to monitor and report back to the Board information on which we may want to take action. Bill Sugg will serve as liaison between our neighborhood and other neighborhood associations.

New Business

Helen Smith, representative from the Sierra Club, announced that EARTH DAY will be held at Miller Park April 22, 1-6 p.m. There will be booths, lots of good food, and entertainment. To volunteer to help call: 723-9282.

Christmas House Tour

Susan Walter reported that four residents have made a commitment to have their houses on the tour scheduled for December 9, 1990. Crystal Towers neighborhood will be included. The Board voted unanimously to charge \$8.00 per person for the tour. Susan also announced that there will be a door decorating contest which may involve more people and get the neighborhood ready for the Christmas Tour.
