Meeting Notes - November 7, 1989

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. By President Martin Sokoloff at the home of Dottie and Bill Wise. There was good attendance for this meeting, even though we were competing with the election.

The Hanes Park Task Force is still moving, if extremely slowly. The selection of a landscape planner is close -- the committee now as a whole needs to decide on the instructions to the planner. The West End affirms again our position of improving and beautifying the existing park -- with no additional development.

Randy Loftis, attending as a spokesman for Petree Stockton & Robinson, explained the acquisition of the Booke property on 4th Street. The law firm now has fully occupied their buildings and has bought the property with a view towards having some options for future growth. No decisions have been made regarding development, the tenants in the house will remain for the present. Several suggestions and comments were made, in particular, that should the property contain parking, a Burke Street entrance would be most desired. The property adjoins the Lovett home and Randy agreed that someone from the firm would make available the land survey to determine the property lines. The Lovetts have a fence running along the line.

Randy stressed the fact that Petree, Stockton has a large investment in the neighborhood and wants to continue being a good neighbor. The board agreed and asked that we be kept current regarding the future of the land

Once again we see that R.S.V.P. doesn't carry the guilt trip of calling to respond! We had two for the square dance social, but taking a head count, decided to go ahead with the party. The Membership Committee distributed 500 leaflets to publicize the event. We should have a head count on new membership in a month or so.
