WEST END BOARD MEETING MINUTES

July 2, 1991

The board met at the home of Sal Aiello and Tim Nichols. President Sugg called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m. There were fifteen members present.

SOCIAL

Missie Vaughan and Tim Nichols reported that the July 4 celebration was ready to go. Membership sign-up sheets will be passed around to new residents and others who may not be members.

MEMBERSHIP

Wanda Merschel reported that the Park Fair will be September 7 and will have a festive theme. Sal Aiello will get information from Charlotte's Dilworth Fair that might help us do it up right in September. Reggie Jackson from the Arts Council will provide music (gratis!) for our Fair. Members of the Association are asked to bring garden seedlings (perennials only), tree seedlings, etc., to the Fair to sell.

GARDEN CLUB

Dottie Wise reported that Grace Court Park was competing in the Appearance Commission's contest. Joanna Hudson has prepared excellent slides and Becky Gibson wrote the narrative which will be entered as our presentation. Dottie has seen the show and reports that it is excellent and we may have a strong chance to win. September is the judging, November announcement of the winner.

OLD BUSINESS

Crystal Towers -- Bill Gibson moved that we support the inclusion of Crystal Towers with the West End neighborhood. Details will be worked

out in the next few months. Becky Sparrow seconded, unanimous approval.

YMCA Variance -- It is still unclear what the variance states. Dottie Wise moved that we continue the dialogue with the standing committee of the YMCA's Board and the CEO until we understand the specifics of the proposed variance. Becky Sparrow seconded. Motion unanimously passed. (Discussion was around the fact that the city is not clear how many parking spaces are needed to fill the needs of the YMCA's programs; should we support "in principle" a variance as opposed to a parking deck; are we opposed to loosing landscaping; the destruction of buildings adjacent to the YMCA; in favor of a parking deck).

NEW BUSINESS

Historic District Commission -- Larry Robb is to rotate off the HDC. The Board offered the following names as replacements from the West End Association: Martin Sokoloff, Glenn Eisenbrandt, Lea Loftis, Susan Walter, Bill Wise and Bill Sugg. Bill Sugg will call the City to report that these people are interested.

Recycling -- West End South has now been included in the recycling program. The West End Association is very enthusiastic and pleased to be participating in this program.

Crime -- Several people mentioned the increase of break-ins lately. Also, the abandoned car problem is back again. There are flyers from the W-S Police Dept. that should be distributed at the next few outings just to help keep people aware of things that they can do to be cautious.

Bill Gibson moved the meeting adjourn, Wade Long seconded, motion passed unanimously to adjourn at 9:15 p.m.
