

RE-CYCLING – WHO NEEDS IT?

I'm a little landfill, small and smashed, Here is your garbage, here is your trash, When I get all filled up, then I roar, Recycle now, or see me next door.

The West End is one of a dozen Winston-Salem neighborhoods included in a city plan to collect recyclable trash -- glass, newspapers, cans and plastic. The program is now expected to go into effect on June 18, 1991. The plan calls for curbside pick-ups on the same day that trash is collected; we don't know yet whether the "curb" can be the back alleys instead of our streets. Each household will be supplied with a bin, into which the recycler will place trash. You'll probably be asked to bag your extra newspapers and set them next to the bin. In early, June, the city will send notices out to each household with more specific what, when, where and how information. Welcome to the 21st century.

ACCIDENT AT HANES PARK

As readers of this newsletter may recall, the topic of safety in the "tot lot" in Hanes Park at the bottom of the hill on Brookstown Avenue has been a topic of discussion at several WEA board meetings.
