Their names and telephone numbers were prominently displayed in last month's newsletter, which, of course, you keep prominently displayed on your bulletin board in the kitchen. No?

What we're asking you to do here is become committed to making the West End, Winston-Salem and Forsyth County into healthy communities in which you, your kids, and your grand-kids will want to live. If you can't get committed, at least get involved. (You probably know the difference: a chicken gets involved in a ham-&-eggs breakfast. A pig gets committed.) Your writer recently spent an exhilirating half-hour with a woman who has gotten committed; she serves as a foster parent for little kids, including at least one crack-baby -- she's white, he's black, it makes no difference.

Here are a couple of easy, pleasant, undemanding ways to get involved. On Tuesday, March 30th, people all over town will celebrate "Hope Du Jour." It's not hard: you go out and eat at one (or more!) participating restaurants, and know that 10% of what you spend will be donated to Crisis Control Ministry. Crisis Control has become Forsyth County's largest provider of emergency relief for individuals and families with urgent needs for food, fuel, clothing, rent and medicine. When someone comes to your front door asking for help, and you're not sure how to respond, one kind thing you can do is to refer them to Crisis Control (another is to direct them to the Samaritan Soup Kitchen).

Here's another easy one. West Ender Peter Perret conducts the prestigious Winston-Salem Piedmont Triad Symphony. West Ender Bob Listokin plays a sweet clarinet. Other symphony instrumentalists live among you, as well as seven singers in the Symphony Chorale. During April or May, subscribe to the Symphony's 1993-94 season and come hear some of your neighbors make beautiful music together. Symphony orchestras help attract corporate employers; corporate employers provide lots of jobs. Lots of jobs help make communities strong. Get it?

Finally, may I suggest you participate in activities which, on their face, might appear contradictory. For example, get busy with Neighborhood Crime Watch in the West End, and at the same time become a volunteer at the Salvation Army Boys' Club or at Big Brothers-Big Sisters. The mix will enrich your life and befuddle your friends.




