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Historic Homes

During the years of 1915-1916, J. P. Hurdle was listed at 1215 West Fourth Street. He was the president of Hurdle Loan and Insurance Company. In 1917, physician John S. Slate and his wife, Nonnie, purchased the house which served as their residence and his office. The house remained in the Slate's ownership and occupancy until 1968.

This eclectic house reflects the Italian Renaissance Revival style although the detailing suggests influences from both the Colonial Revival and Craftsman styles. The two-storey tan brick veneer is characterized by a symmetrical three-bay facade with a recessed central entrance bay and hipped roof. The exterior detailing includes a glass and wood paneled door with leaded glass sidelights and transom. The transoms are duplicated over the facade windows. There is a deck above the main entrance with its own entrance. The front porch has Tuscan colonettes set on brick plinths with a plain balustrade. A matching porte-cochere is located on the north side.

The house interior is equally impressive with Colonial Revival and Craftsman mantels, a closed string stair with a newel light figure, beaded board wainscot and sliding pocket doors. It has boxed beam ceilings and high wainscot in the dining room.
