But our thanks goes to Recreation and Parks Department for the great work they have done in fixing light fixtures and clock and maintaining the park. **Tise House:** Mike Macko wants to put a coffee shop in the basement. Events for West End and other neighborhood associations will be gratis. The West End room will be for the use of our Association. The group voted to have the holiday party as scheduled in December at the Merschels. It was decided to do a social in February at the Tise House. **By Laws:** Revisions are not finished yet. **Burke Street:** Bars and parking situation – no update was ready for the meeting. **Historic Overlay Guidelines:** Eric Elliott mentioned that the State of Pennsylvania has a law that limits the right of property owners to demolish their historic properties. George will look into this. **Safety:** Brochures given out on preventing car theft. People are going around checking locks on cars in the neighborhood. New WEA Board member: The Board voted to add Steve Joiner as a new member. Steve was a neighborhood president in Arlington, VA for eight years. **Importance of lobbying and voting:** Eric Elliott reported that in the spring Brunson Elementary was to get over \$1 million in renovations in the school bond package, but it is now down to \$270,000 because people didn't make noise when the commissioners and school board were negotiating. Whitaker Elementary in Buena Vista went from money for renovations to funding for a new school. Elliott spoke about the need to support Brunson as a neighborhood anchor, even for those without children. Warren Sparrow said that a neighborhood's poor turnout at the polls, as in the recent primary, would be noticed when decisions are made. He encouraged all to vote on November 6. **Historic District Commission:** The Certificate of Appropriateness to demolish YMCA houses had expired. It has to come back to the HDC at their October 3 meeting. In the original COA there were

Our thanks to Steve and Nora for a great party at last month's West End social on Glade Street – great hosts and a great turn out. Won't you join us this month? We will be hosting our **West End monthly social at the home of board members Alex and Marty Flowers, 638 N. Spring St. from 6:00 til 8:00 pm on Friday, November 9.** We look forward to seeing you there.

And speaking of parties – please put this date on your calendar. **Saturday, December 8, will be the date of our neighborhood Christmas party at the home of John and Wanda Merschel, 1211 W. 4th St.** The Association will provide drinks and turkey and ham – we ask you to bring a side or appetizer. This is a great neighborhood tradition - in large part, because we have great neighbors.

The City is previewing its long-range transportation plan at various locations over the next month, inviting public comment. Two projects potentially affect West Enders. There are plans to extend 14th Street to Stratford Rd., cutting across the current Children's Home property. And more at home, there is a priority on extending Eighth Street renovations (the MLK extensions from East Winston) and connecting Eighth Street across Cherry down to the intersection of Northwest and Reynolda, taking traffic off of Northwest Blvd. Current traffic on Northwest is 8000 cars a day and is expected to almost double by 2025 without relief. Only one business is directly in the line of the proposed route but many businesses and homes on our periphery would be near such an extension through the kudzu. Contact Greg Errett at the Transportation Department (727-2707) with comments and see the full plan at one of the local advertised meetings.

With all the tragedy and stress of recent weeks, it is a good time for thanksgiving. We have much to be grateful for in this country – even the right to disagree with each other over what our blessings and hopes are. But we are grateful for people like you. no conditions put on the demolition. George encouraged Planning Department staff to recommend that the old walnut trees be saved and include a timetable for plantings. **YMCA:** Bill Gibson recommended that the Y be commended for doing the landscaping right around the men's entrance and encouraged to duplicate the good work they have done there on the West End Blvd site if they remove the houses. A motion was made and passed to empower a member of the West End association to formulate wording to request a substantial landscaping site plan with a timeline for planting and maintenance.

Neighborhood Development Plan: George Bryan met with City/County planner Judy Hunt regarding the development plan that is currently in process. She indicated that they will be asking WEA for certain people from our neighborhood to sit on that body. They are working on six neighborhoods. George asked her whether West First and Westdale will be included. Two Reynolda/West End Street merchants (antique shops) have asked to be included in the West End. We need to update our long-range plan. **Neighborhood Brochure:** Eric Elliott reported that the CVB (Convention and Visitors Bureau) will work with us to develop a brochure which could be handed out to upcoming visitors of the opera festival and others in 2002. The bureau would distribute up to 10,000 brochures as part of an effort to advertise the city's neighborhoods. **Landscaping:** An inventory of trees in the neighborhood was recently done because the tree canopy that was at one time characteristic of our neighborhood is being lost. Identified were places for 96 trees. Landscape Designer Bill Gould made these recommendations. Also identified were sidewalks that have the original "dimpled" texture. George is investigating a renewal of this pattern in the neighborhood. The markings are from the 1920s. There is a question as to whether these were pre-fab or textured in place. It was noted that the Jarvis street dead end needs a landscape barrier, and that the YWCA may apply to the Winston-Salem Foundation to fix their walls and landscaping.

Industrial Area Foundation is an activist organization that offers strategies for citizen groups for effective citizen action. They are conducting two training sessions in upcoming weeks for neighborhood folks. Contact Ellen Yarborough (723-9060) for more information. **Neighborhood Alliance** annual dues of \$25.00 were reported due. We voted to pay our membership. The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 PM. **Next meeting:** At Tise House (Fourth and Glade), November 6, 7pm.
