Oh, and one more thing - go to the Dalllas Convention & Visitors Bureau's website and you'll find a whole section devoted to their West End Historic District - descriptions, history, pictures, etc. with useful links to other related aspects of the West End. Winston Salem's comparable site will tell you that there are some shops and restaurants in the neighborhood - and there's even a small paragraph describing the West End in far from excitng terms. I don't think that's good enough, do you? We on the board should see if we can do something that's a whole lot better for Winston Salem and the West End. You see, we're not just any West End, this is Winston Salem's West End, and we should both make the most of it!
