PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

While the WEA is supportive of the new stadium as good for the West End, downtown Winston-Salem, and the city/county in general, we felt that the issues that arose merited more attention and elaboration. Subsequent to the Planning Board Meeting, our council person Wanda Merschel arranged for a meeting among the developers and their hired experts, city staff, and the community citizens. This meeting was most comprehensive, and we feel it adequately dealt with all the outstanding issues, often in impressive detail. And while generally satisfied with the solutions to the potential problems we had identified, we continued to be concerned with what would follow the good intentions. In other words, we needed a mechanism that could insure that the construction and the completion of the stadium would follow the planning scheme agreed upon by all parties. This mechanism would also make it possible for the community to raise its voice if the planned guidelines were not adhered to properly.

At the meeting a very good idea emerged that went a long way toward securing a mechanism that would establish a working relationship between the Winston Salem communities impacted by the stadium and the stadium developers. The idea centered on the idea that the association presidents could form a committee that would represent the concerned citizenry. This committee would keep a dialogue going with stadium developers. We believe this good faith endeavor will mollify those who believe that things will change after they are created and that the neighborhood will then suffer. With the knowledge that after the stadium is constructed there is yet a second phase to be developed, we see this committee as essential to the ongoing community involvement and support. There remain contentious issues—the noise of fireworks for example, as well as the impact of sound from concert performances.

The WEA believes that these issues can be dealt with as they arise and that the developers have a vested interest in maintaining open communication with the neighborhoods affected by the project. In light of the studies conducted and the conditions as now written into the proposal before the city council, we feel confident that the Brookstown Stadium will have a positive influence on our community and that with the creation of an oversight committee that monitors the neighborhood impact that, we can now and will continue to support the arrival of and continued presence of the project near the West End. We encourage the City Council to move forward on the approval of the project.

Crime Watch

As many of you already know, Winston-Salem police arrested a man last week in connection with the stabbing and robbery of another man last Saturday night in the West End neighborhood. The crime occurred on the 200 block of West End Boulevard. The victims of the crime were treated and released from the hospital and the alleged criminal was apprehended by the Winston-Salem police. He is being held in the Forsyth County Jail, with bond set at \$137,000.

Even though the prime suspect in this crime has been jailed, we should all be especially diligent these days in reporting suspicious behavior. Here are some tips from the West End Central Neighborhood Watch Group, already run in this publication but worth repeating in light of this recent event.

Get to know your neighbors and who lives in, works in or frequents your part of the neighborhood regularly. Take note of who's doing lawn and home maintenance, what they look like, and what vehicles they drive.

Keep your cell phone with you on walks through the neighborhood and program them with the police non-emergency number: 773-7700. If you see something suspicious that you feel should be checked out but that is non-threatening, call the police non-emergency number. If you see something that looks like a crime in progress or that might imminently lead to a crime in progress, call 911.

Be sure that you have good lighting all around your property and that there aren't old structures and overgrown areas that would provide good hiding places. Close up the old structures and trim back any overgrown areas so you can see that no one is lurking on your property.

It's all about awareness and keeping your eyes open for signs of suspicious activity.
