This year will be the 18th year local restaurants donate 10% of their proceeds from the day to Crisis Control. Over 100 restaurants at www.hopedujour.org will participate. You will notice the majority are locally owned and operated establishments and many are located right here in the West End. West End Café, The Old Fourth Street Filling Station, The Lighthouse, Grecian Corner, and the Zevely House all advertise in *The West Ender* and are all participating restaurants in Hope du Jour. One of the presenting sponsors of this event is the West End-based firm of Leonard Ryden Burr.

Crisis Control Ministry, a Charity Navigator 4-star charity, is the largest emergency assistance provider in Forsyth County distributing in their last fiscal year over \$3.5 million in services including \$2.1 million in prescription medications. The work of CCM is done by over 500 volunteers and 18 paid staff. Clients are interviewed to verify the need for assistance with rent or mortgage payments, utility payments, food or prescription medications.



Free Government Funds Available to Remove and Clean Up Unused Buried Home Heating Oil Tanks

Most homes built before 1975 used an underground tank for storing home heating oil. Even if your home does not use home heating oil now, you may still have a tank buried underground. These tanks have been slowly corroding underground for years past their intended 15-20 year life expectancy. In addition to tank corrosion, decades of drips, spills and overfill during tank filing may have caused soil contamination.

Luckily there is a state fund to cover the cost of tank excavation and soil clean up. You do not have to pay anything to remove the tanks and contaminated soil.

Most people do not know that they have a buried oil tank. And most people do not know there is a fund available to cover the cost of removal of the buried tank and soil clean up. You can tell if you have a buried tank by finding 1-2 steel pipes measuring approx 2” in diameter sticking out of the ground.

- 1) Most tanks leak, or have had some oil spilled around the filling point which results in soil contamination, obviously not good for the environment. Even if the tank is empty, has been filled with foam or sand, or has been removed, soil contamination may exist at the property.
- 2) Many mortgage companies now require the tank to be removed on sale or re-finance of a home as they consider them a liability.
- 3) The fund has finite dollars, so the time to act is now, while the fund is available
