


### Service Bulletin Board on Blog



### Birds in the West End



This photo of a young red-tailed hawk was taken from the doorway of our second-floor balcony on September 12<sup>th</sup>. He sat quietly while we went in and out, got the binoculars, whispered excitedly, and found the camera. He sat while we tool several pictures before lazily taking wing toward the YMCA; his family nest would be at the Children's Home. We have a 30-foot greet hemlock in our back yard whose top one quarter is bare, seen in the photo. Birds always love perching on its high tip. Recently, while having morning coffee on the balcony, we watched juvenile red-bellied woodpeckers, with zebra stripes and red cap, calling Ma for food, like teenagers do everywhere.

Flickers, with their dappled chests and black front collars, like to sit there and preen. These are just two of many, many species that we see sitting up top of our hemlock. I make a point of this because that leafless branch or bare dogwood in your own yard can be a favorite perch, and will give you a very cleat view of the birds. Phil Dickinson, co-writer of the Tuesday Bird Column in the Winston-Salem Journal, mentioned a recent discussion with his wife over the dead dogwood in their yard; he, of course, wanted it up because it attracted birds and she wanted the ugly thing down. I don't know what happened to Phil's Dogwood. I do, however, know we and the birds get much joy from our bare hemlock treetop.

# A Neighborhood Watch in the West End

Many neighbors have discussed starting a neighborhood watch. We have contacted the Crime Prevention officer for our area and have invited her to attend the WEA meeting on Oct. 14<sup>th</sup>. In preparation for this meeting, we must complete "Phase I" of the neighborhood watch program. The only way a neighborhood watch program will work is if people get involved. Please contact thewestender@yahoo.com before October 10<sup>th</sup> if you are interested in becoming more involved in keeping our neighborhood safe. We must have a chairperson and block captains before the October meeting.

### Phase One: How to Get Started

- 1. Determine who will serve as the Chairperson. The Chairperson will lead and be responsible for the group activities and meetings. They will keep the group informed on concerns and what is going on in the neighborhood. The Chairperson will establish a preferred means of communicating with watch members—e.g., newsletter, telephone trees, e-mail, etc. The Chairperson will also keep in touch with the Neighborhood Watch Coordinator at the Police Department.
- 2. Determine who will serve as block captains. They serve as liaisons between the neighborhood and the chairperson and communicate information about meetings and crime incidents to all residents.
- 3. Determine neighborhood boundaries: North, South, East and West.
- 4. Call a Crime Prevention Officer with all of this information when it is determined

(A criminal history will be run on the chairperson and block captains selected. These positions will have access to sensitive information that requires this to be done.)
