 **West End Hummingbirds** 

My husband Bob and I enjoy sitting on the 2nd floor balcony of our home with an early-morning cup of coffee, an inspirational book, and--of course--the delightful activities of the awakening birds. Our beautiful view into backyards and treetops is especially nice when the hummingbird feeder (that hangs 7 ft from us at eyelevel) is visited repeatedly by ruby-throated hummingbirds.

We know they pull in nectar with their long tongues, but so far we couldn't quite see it happen. Last week, a female hovered 8 inches from Bob's forehead for several seconds; then zipped sideways in front of me, staring, wings buzzing loudly. Curious? Aggressive? Friendly? We chose friendly, although we'll never know. Certainly they are comfortable feeding on nectar while we feed on cappuccinos. Although I have not had the good fortune of finding their nest, my niece, Linda, *has*. While in Colorado, a hummingbird built a very visible nest on the path to the women's restroom. Linda and others would chant as they passed the nest, "Haaaaaaaatch! Haaaaaatch!" And the tiny babies DID hatch before Linda's 2 weeks were up!

These tales illustrate the fearlessness of hummers. They have been known to attack jays, hawks, even snakes. Of course none of the above would be interested in gulping down a mere tenth of an ounce of feathers and bones. Here are a few facts about ARCHILOCHUS COLUBRIS, our only hummer in the East—

- *At 80 wing beats per second, they go up, down, backwards, sideways and even upside down.
- *They migrate to Mexico, crossing the Gulf, without stopping.
- *They can reach speeds up to 60 mph.

Bird watching is a hobby that both Bob and I both enjoy—but watching hummingbirds is an especially interesting treat!

New Use For Glade YWCA?

West Ender Teresa Dillon is leading a grass roots effort to turn the Glade Street YWCA into a adult community center. She will be at our September board meeting to discuss the idea and would love to hear from the neighborhood—so please attend! Below is an article from earlier this summer about the topic...

Nearly six weeks after the YWCA announced that it would close its Glade Street branch, a group of about 20 people is trying to organize a grass-roots effort to buy and operate the building as an adult community center.

The effort is being coordinated by Teresa Dillon, who asked friends to circulate an e-mail inviting anyone who was interested to come and discuss their ideas for the building. The group met yesterday at the Panera Bread restaurant at the Cloverdale Shopping Center and decided to call itself the Save Glade Street Coalition.

The Glade Street YWCA, which opened in 1942, experienced a significant drop in membership after the Gateway YWCA opened in 2007. The YWCA board has said it will try to sell the Glade Street building. Dillon said she has collected at least 100 e-mails from people who would like to see the building used for the benefit of the community.

Dillon's group has not yet done any fundraising, but several people who attended the meeting said they want to see the group try to link up with a larger entity in the area, such as one of the hospitals or the Piedmont Triad Research Park.

One of those, Irma Jackson, said that a lot of details need to be worked out, but a lot of support exists in the community to do something.

"I think it's possible," she said, "but I think it's going to take lots of work."


West End Homes Tour Update...
