

Creative Corridors Coalition is sponsoring two events in October:

1 1st Annual Tour de Winston, Sunday, Oct. 23, 3-4 pm, with an after party 4-5pm, Corpening Plaza. Adult Entry Fee: \$10 includes t-shirt, food, and admission to the post-walk party featuring music, games, giveaways and more. Children ages 12 & under, free. The Tour de Winston is a 5K walk event designed to take participants on a downtown tour of the bridges and corridors that are being re-imagined as part of the Creative Corridors Coalition project. The course begins and ends at Corpening Plaza and traverses the downtown area. Along the route, walkers will encounter Winston-Salem sites and businesses offering opportunities for photos of many of our local icons. Water stops will be at miles 1 & 2 at the United Metropolitan Baptist Church and the Milton Rhodes Center for the Arts. You will walk 3.1 miles of the corridors and over or under 10 of the bridges that are being re-imagined by the Creative Corridors Coalition. ARTSfest 2011 was a resounding success. In spite of early morning heavy rains and boisterous thunderstorms early that Saturday morning, the weather cleared, the temperature remained cool all day, the rain stayed away, and neighbors from all over the city and region came to enjoy the art on display. Eighty one artists applied for admission and sixty one applicants were entered in the show. We had visitors from 22 cities in North Carolina as well as visitors from Virginia, Georgia, South Carolina, Ohio, Minnesota, Indiana, and even from Glasgow, Scotland!

Artist award winners included:

- Merit Award – Jennie Lorette Keatts (jewelry), Suzanna Ravenswing (jewelry), Patrick Robertson (mixed media), and Susan Crouch (painting)
- Juror Award – Nell Chandler (jewelry), Glenn Mace (wood), Veronica and David Bennett (mixed media), Michael Mahan (pottery)
- Best in Show – Erik Dahlager (photography)

"Thank you, everyone for making this my favorite show of the year. All the volunteers were amazing and all the visitors were fantastic," said artist Lori Flanders. Artist Melanie Micalc added that "this was a great event. Great music, fellow artists and the volunteers were beyond helpful." Various other musings from artists were heard: "first rate show!"; "Quality of art excellent!"; "Best festival I have been in!"; "Loved it, always a lot of fun."

Of course with an effort like this we owe many thanks to all of the artists without whom we would have had no show. We must also thank all our sponsors, in-kind and monetary, large and small. The West End Association backed the effort in part with seed money to prime the pump and get the festival started.
