

## Woody Clinard Recognized

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## Help Decide the Future of Hanes Park



The next phase of the Hanes Park renovation is under way. West End board members **John Merschel** and **George Bryan** represented the West End Neighborhood Association at a meeting of stakeholders held at the offices of **MLA Design Group**, the landscape architects who have been hired for the project. The planning process is expected to be completed in September or October. The landscape architects are presently taking an inventory of the park and its surroundings. The next step will be public meetings to receive further input sometime in June or July. Participants were asked to complete a questionnaire and return it.

1. What are the assets of the park?
2. What are the top 5 priorities for the park?
3. What are the top 5 concerns (be specific?)
4. What would you like us to know that we might otherwise not know?
5. What is the biggest threat to the park?
6. Do you have documentation or any information that you possess that you would be willing to share?

George and John are formulating answers to reflect the latest Hanes Park study recently approved by the West End Association board. They will include copies of this study, along with the 1991 and the 1976 studies and the agreement between the school system and the city regarding the Park, as part of the package they submit. They would appreciate any thoughts, ideas, or suggestions West Enders may have about the questions above, the process in general, or the park. This is our opportunity to influence the future of Hanes Park in a positive direction.

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## UDO Changes impact West End



The City-County Planning Board approved on Thursday, May 14th changes to the Unified Development Ordinances (UDO) that would affect the West End Historic Overlay. The majority of the changes are intended to clearly document processes now in effect. Key in these changes is that property owners will have three years to complete approved Certificates of Appropriateness (COAs) projects. Staff of the Historic Resources Commission will require the COA applicant to send photographs of the project in a report for review by the HRC staff when the project is completed. The new changes will clearly state that property owners who have after-the-fact COAs will be required to pay a fee for HRC staff to review project reports. This fee is set by the City Council and increases on each occasion. Such a fee has been in place for years. There is also a doubled inspection fee if the Inspections Department has been involved.

These changes in the UDO will be presented to a committee of the Winston-Salem City Council for consideration on June 1.

### Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Library Update

If a walk down Fifth Street reminds you of what we've lost with the closing of the Central Library, a visit to the web site link below might dispel the gloom. Click on the Central Library link for an article outlining what is to come and view the schematic drawings of the new Central Library. The new design was announced during a meeting of the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners in November. The building will have 103,000 square feet of flexible space, a 17,000 square foot increase over the old library, and will include a cafe/coffee bar, a 305 seat auditorium, and an outdoor reading garden. The project is scheduled for completion early in 2017.

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
